Rector's Letter May 2026



If asked to choose my favourite season I would have to say Spring, as I think it is the most inspiring and hopeful time of year. With all the new life that is appearing from the ground; the birds nesting and rearing their young; the lambs in the fields and the sun shining.

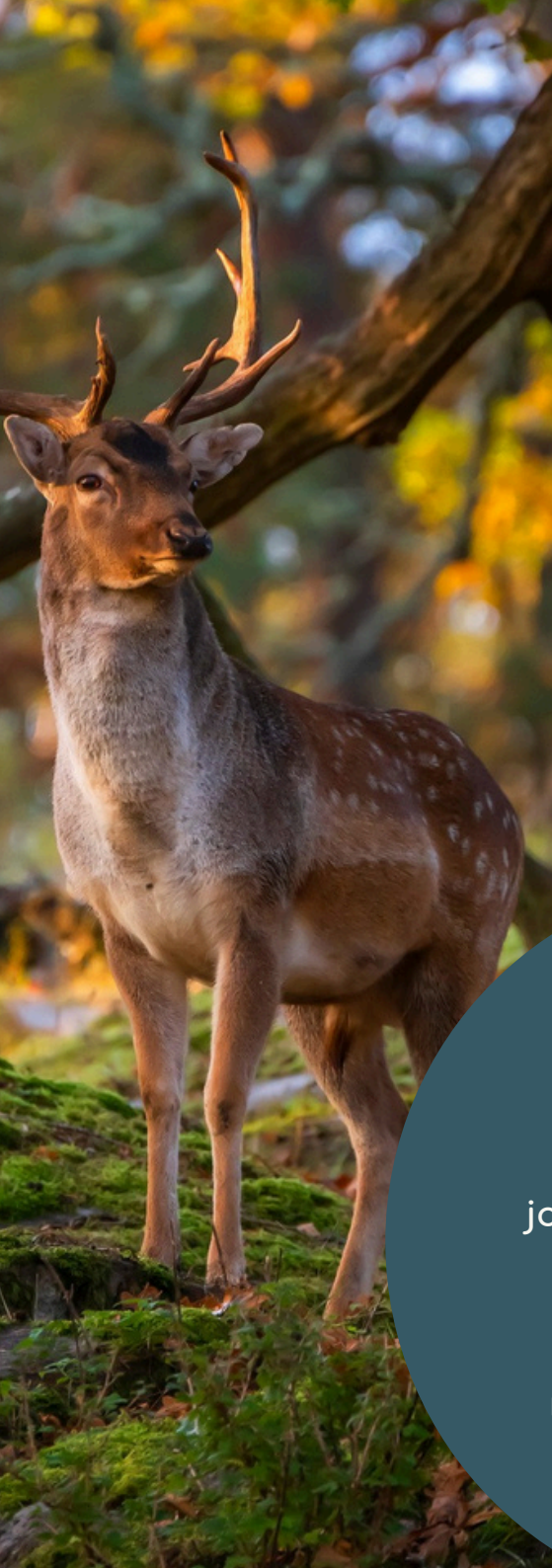
It is a time of year which has been expressed in art, word and song since the very beginning of time and one of my favourite hymns for a spring Sunday morning service is Morning has broken. Written by Eleanor Farjeon (1881-1965) the verses were written specifically to fit a Gaelic tune called Bunessan. The tune had been noted down in the 1880s from the singing of a wandering Highlander and a friend of Miss Farjeon wanted to find alternative words for the beautiful tune, on the theme of thanksgiving for each new day.

Beginning with the lines “Morning has broken, like the first morning, blackbird has spoken like the first bird” it truly is a song of praise to God the creator. The hymn also achieved considerable fame as a pop song recorded by Cat Stevens in the early 1970’s.

Today, more than ever, we are aware of the fragility of our world but also of the difference we can all make to improve the environment around us. In our churchyards we are increasingly working with nature, allowing some areas to grow wild while respecting the need for graves to be tended and accessible. This year Ecton and Great Doddington churches have applied to the Wildlife Trust for a Churchyard Conservation Bronze Award <https://www.wildlifebcn.org/about-us/advice-landowners/wild-churchyards> and we are looking forward to a visit from the Trust in the near future.

I am very grateful to all who manage our three churchyards, for they provide not only places of peace, beauty and harmony for everyone but safe habitats for all of God’s creation, which, as the hymn reminds us, is a gift to be thankful for each new day.

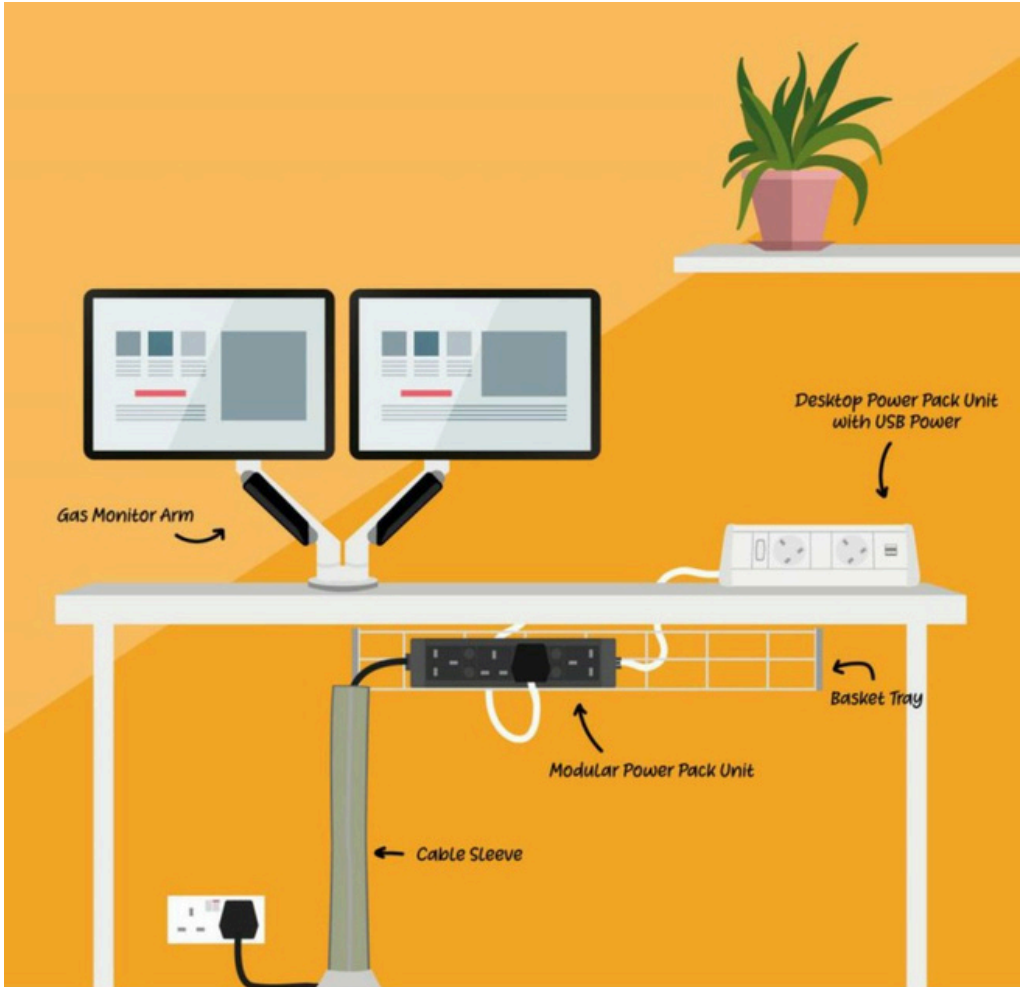

Ecton History Group

A 17th Century Link between Two Historic Ecton Families

In the Northampton Records Office, I recently examined the Wills of Henry Bagley, Bell Founder and Thomas Franklin, Blacksmith & Clerk both buried in Ecton Churchyard.

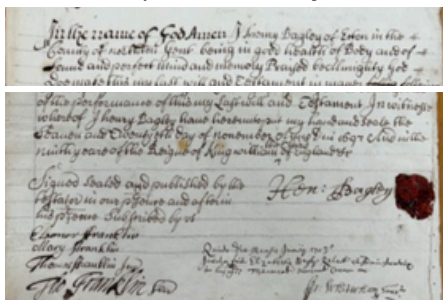
Henry Bagley moved to The Manor House in Ecton in 1687, and rebuilt it in 1694, the datestone reads H.E.B. 1694 (Henry & Elizabeth Bagley) he was the eldest Son of Henry Bagley of Chacombe, Northamptonshire and followed the family trade as a Bell Founder.

He worked closely with Thomas Franklin, eldest of 4 Sons, who also continued in his families trade as a Blacksmith and then, in his later life, he became a Clerk to the Commissioner for Taxes.

Henry's Will is dated 27 November 1697 and Thomas's is dated 15 September 1697. The Wills of both Gentlemen are countersigned by them and other members of their families, Thomas died first on 6th January 1703 and Henry a couple of months later, his Burial was on 1st April 1703.

More details on their work together will be a topic for discussion at our next meeting, this time on **Thursday 7th May at 7.30pm** at The Three Horseshoes, all are very welcome.
